

2024 Advent Series (OLP and SJV Parishes)

Have you noticed the advertisements and store displays telling us it is time to get ready for Christmas? It does take time to shop and bake and prepare for gatherings for family and friends, so maybe it really is time to start even before

Halloween.

But there is so much more to getting ready for Christmas. The Church gives us four weeks to prepare for Christmas and the Christmas season. The time is called Advent, which means *coming*. We prepare for the *coming* of Jesus at Christmas. But wait – He already came at Bethlehem. And, as we pray in the Creed, He *will come* again at the end of time to judge the living and the dead. And He *is* with us each and every day.

The **Advent Series** will give you an opportunity to prepare a sacred space in your mind and heart for His *coming* (in Bethlehem, at the end of time and now) as we prayerfully read the scriptures for the four Sundays of Advent. We will use Bishop Baron's <u>Advent Gospel Reflections</u> as well as commentaries from scripture scholars.

The <u>Advent Gospel Reflections</u> as well as commentary texts will be provided. If you have a Bible, bring it! If no, not to worry, we will have extra Bibles.

Para permitirnos servirle mejor, todos los feligreses deben registrarse en la oficina parroquial. Si usted es un nuevo feligrés, o un feligrés actual que se mudó o cambió de número de teléfono, por favor contacte a la Oficina Parroquial.

Los miembros de la familia de 23 años o más deben registrarse por separado como individuos, incluso si continúan viviendo con sus padres. Debe ser un feligrés registrado para ser un Patrocinador de Confirmación o un Padrino.

REQUISITOS PARA SER PADRINO/PATROCINADOR DE CONFIRMACIÓN

Debe ser un feligrés ACTIVO, REGISTRADO por un mínimo de seis meses que asista a misa semanalmente y contribuya al apoyo de la Iglesia, de acuerdo con los medios de uno.

Debe haber recibido todos los sacramentos de iniciación. Si está casado, debe estar en un matrimoni reconocido como válido por la Iglesia Católica.

Family members 23 years or older should register separately as individuals even if continuing to live with their parents. You must be a registered parishioner to be a Confirmation Sponsor or a Godparent.


GODPARENT/CONFIRMATION SPONSOR REQUIREMENTS

Must be an ACTIVE, REGISTERED parishioner for a minimum of six months, who attends Mass weekly, and contributes to the support of the Church, in accordance with one's means.

Must have received all the Sacraments of Initiation.

If married, must be in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church.

Must live a Christian life consistent with the role of godparent or sponsor.

The Pastor's Pen

Dear Friend.

A pastor friend wrote to me about an article in a campus publication where a young nurse writes of her pilgrimage of learning to see in a patient the image of God beneath a very "distressing disguise."

Eileen was one of her first patients, a person who was totally helpless. "A cerebral aneurysm (broken blood vessels in the brain) had left her with no conscious control over her body," the nurse writes. As near as the doctors could tell Eileen was totally unconscious, unable to feel pain and unaware of anything going on around her.

It was the job of the hospital staff to turn her every hour to prevent bedsores and to feed her twice a day, "what looked like a thin mush through a stomach tube."

Caring for her was a thankless task. "When it's this bad," and older student nurse told her, "you have to detach yourself emotionally from the whole situation..."

As a result, more and more Eileen came to be treated as a thing, a vegetable. But the young student nurse decided that she could not treat Eileen like the others had treated her. She talked to her, sang to her, encouraged her and even brought her little gifts.

One day when things were especially difficult and it would have been easy for the young nurse to take out her frustrations on the patient, she was especially kind.

It was Thanksgiving Day and the nurse said to the patient, "I was in a cruddy mood this morning, Eileen, because it was supposed to be my day off. But now that I'm here, I'm glad. I wouldn't have wanted to miss seeing you on Thanksgiving. Do you know this is Thanksgiving?"

Just then the telephone rang, and as the nurse turned to answer it, she looked quickly back at the patient. Suddenly, she writes, Eileen was "looking at me ... crying. Big damp circles stained her pillow, and she was shaking all over."

That was the only human emotion that Eileen ever showed any of them, but it was enough to change the whole attitude of the hospital staff toward her.

Not long afterward, Eileen died.

The young nurse closes her story, saying, "I keep thinking about her. It occurred to me that I owe her an awful lot. Except for Eileen, I might never have known what it's like to give myself to someone who can't give back."

Even in the most confusing and uncertain moments, pray always and never lose heart.
